DEVOTIONS

Epiphany

On January 6, the church will celebrate Epiphany, which is a Greek word meaning "manifestation." Christ's significance to the world

was first made apparent (manifest) when three wise men came traveling far across the desert, following a moving star, in search of a newborn king.

As we reflect upon 2018, we recall the good and the bad, and consider what we've lost and gained. And then we turn our attention to the future making resolutions to improve some aspect of life for ourselves or for others. Perhaps the story of the wise men can teach us about seeking and finding hope.

First, they went out looking for the great God-given goodness they believed existed. It's always easier to stay where we are, despairing, and fortifying our own positions. But sometimes, finding new hope requires that we venture out in faith. Maybe you'll need to risk a change or two in your life to discover the newborn hope you long to find.

Second, the wise men brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These seem like strange gifts for a baby, but they were the most valuable things the kings possessed. When you go out in search of new hope, bring your best gifts, and prepare to give them away. You'll be surprised how offering your time, your resources, or your love and prayers benefit those who receive these gifts from you. And you'll feel more hopeful, useful, and valuable because of what you've been able to give.

Finally, after finding Jesus, the wise men returned by another road. When you go out in search of newborn hope, you may change your paths. New hope can reorient us and redirect us. As we begin 2019, I hope that you can rejoice in all that is good – especially in the nearness of God. Happy New Year! - PASTOR MACLEAN
