



# God's Story and Ours

The cover of this month's Messenger is a 17th-century painting of St. Luke, writing his Gospel, and reflects a conviction that animates much of my work as a pastor and leader in the Church: if the Christian Church in North America is to grow again, we need to discover in Scripture stories that are both interesting and influential. Both those "i" words matter: "Interesting." While we may have grown up thinking that the Bible is important, or authoritative, or even inspired, I don't know how many of us actually found the stories in Scripture all that interesting. Similarly, "influential." The stories that are important to us – whether in the Bible, from our favorite books and movies, or peddled by Madison Avenue – often influence, whether consciously or not, the decisions we make about how we will spend our time, energy, and resources.

Interesting and influential. You can see almost immediately not only that both of these words are important, but also interconnected. Because if we don't find biblical stories interesting, it's hard to imagine that they will exercise all that much influence over our daily decisions or dilemmas.

The importance of finding in the Bible stories that are both interesting and influential is a big part of why we are following a more narrative approach in our Sunday worship and Sunday school this year. But an even deeper concern is that we see these stories not simply as God's story – the stories told by the faithful through the ages about God and God's work in the world – but also our story, those stories that tell us the truth about our life with each other in this world.


St. Luke wrote, as he says at the beginning of his Gospel, so that readers will know, believe, and trust the truth of the Gospel. It's for this very reason that, throughout the coming months, we will be invited not simply to learn some of the important stories about Jesus that Luke tells us, but also to find ourselves in them. What do I mean by that? Simply that we can identify with the characters, imagine that what Jesus says to them he also says to us, and discover in their story parallels to our hopes and dreams, opportunities and challenges. On February 3, for instance, Jesus promises his disciples that they will become "fishers for people." What does that mean, not only for the twelve original disciples, but for the 14,000 present-day disciples that make up Mount Olivet Church? Might we be "catching people" when we invite them to worship or to a fellowship event? What about our volunteering at Simpson House and other outreach ministries? And what about our daily activities as spouse or parent, employee or volunteer, student or friend? How is God using us to "fish" for people in these ordinary places? These questions help us make this story our own.

Are you getting a sense of how this works? The Bible has stories about God's encounter with people long ago that help show us the patterns of how God continues to get involved in our lives today. So the more we read and talk about these stories, the easier it is to recognize God's presence and activity in our lives now.

I always find it interesting that the Bible not only begins at the beginning with the story of creation (the word "Genesis" literally means "the beginning"), but it also ends at the very end, with the story in Revelation of God's complete redemption of the world. Which means that this story isn't over yet, that it continues even today, and that we are invited to take up our part and play our role in God's ongoing mission to save, love, and bless the world. The stories we tell and share on Sundays are, indeed, God's story, but they are also ours, and I'm eager for you to see yourselves in them, understand how they can shape your life, and share them

with others with confidence. I'll see you in Church!



# Look Up this Lent!

Our Lenten theme this year is both simple and imperative: "Look Up!" Look up to see the actual people God has placed in your life. Look up to appreciate, enjoy, and care for the beauty of the world God has created and entrusted to us. Look up to see God continually at work in our lives for good.

One way we will do this is by connecting our faith with the myriad ways that technology is shaping our lives. We'll delve into this idea through two **TRUTH TALKS** (at each campus) on Wednesday evenings in Lent, first exploring how technology has helped us extend ourselves by connecting with more people and places via social media, and then wondering how we can retain what is most important to us in terms of our ideals and values and see each other as beloved children of God – even online.

Our **LENT MIDWEEK** worship services will revolve around biblical stories of what happens when we look up: we see God at work in our lives, we see people with needs we can meet, we discover people with gifts to share, and we are surprised at what God is doing right in front of us!

**SUNDAY SCRIPTURE READINGS** – that inform sermons, music, prayers, and Sunday school lessons each week – share with us some of the really "big" stories of Luke's Gospel, including the parables of "The Good Samaritan" and "The Prodigal Son," both of which surprise us with God's grace when we look up to see it. And our **LENTEN DEVOTIONS** follow Jesus' Passion, reminding us that when we look up to the cross we see God's incredible love for us laid bare.
