Celebrations!

Celebrations matter. They remind us of where we've come from and what we've accomplished. In this way, they also remind us of who we are and where we're

going.

Think for a moment of the Fourth of July celebration we'll enjoy early this month. When we remember the story of the Founders of this country boldly signing the Declaration of Independence and thereby risking life and limb for their convictions, we gain a greater sense of the importance of freedom and are motivated to participate in our democracy to safeguard it. Similarly, on Reformation Sunday, we not only mark the historic significance of Martin Luther hammering his 95 Theses onto the door of the castle church in Wittenberg, but are reminded that we continue to be shaped by the free grace that is ours in Christ. Celebrations matter. They root us in our identity, remind us of our heritage, and point the way forward into our future.

This fall, we'll begin a very important celebration: the Centennial Anniversary of Mount Olivet Lutheran Church! Think about that for a moment. For one hundred years, Mount Olivet has been welcoming people into the fellowship we share as disciples of Christ. We have been educating children, offering pastoral care and support, creating opportunities to grow in faith, marrying couples, baptizing children, burying the faithful, caring for one another, gathering for worship, surrounding each other and the larger world with prayer, meeting the needs of our communities, and in all these ways witnessing to our faith in God through both our words and actions... for one hundred years!

We have several important goals for this celebration. The first I'd describe as primarily internal: Develop greater awareness of, and engagement in, Mount Olivet's mission by giving thanks to God for our history and listening for God's call for the future. The second, by contrast, is more externally focused: Share Mount Olivet's story with, and heighten our profile in and connection to, the communities we serve. The third goal is, perhaps, the overarching, even ultimate goal of our celebration: In this way, prepare Mount Olivet for another century of faithful service!

Perhaps it's just as important to name what is not a goal: Simply celebrating Mount Olivet. Don't get me wrong, there is a lot to celebrate! But... celebration is not an end in itself. Rather, we will give thanks for what has been accomplished and look ahead to the

opportunities in front of us, all in order to prepare to answer God's call in the coming century. Dag Hammarskjöld, the Swedish diplomat and Secretary General of the United Nations, sums up our hopes for this celebration in the following brief prayer: "For all that has been, thank you! For all that is to come, yes!"

In a mailing to go out later this summer and in the September Messenger, we will share more of the dates, plans, events, and ways to participate in this important celebration. For now, I want you to mark on your calendar Sunday, September 8, as the Kickoff to our celebration. Rally Sunday, the first day of a new program year when Sunday School is back in session, the Choirs are again in the loft, and folks are returning from summer vacations near and far, is always a joyous time of seeing familiar and new faces, renewing relationships, and looking ahead to a wonderful year. This year, it will be even more special, as we officially start our Centennial Celebration with festival worship and a "Centennial Block Party" at both campuses. In Minneapolis, we'll close off James Avenue behind the church and use the parkland behind Burroughs School to have food, games, and fun activities for all ages. At our West campus, we'll have the same inter-generational events and family-friendly focus, but our celebration will be spread throughout our newly opened West Campus addition! Indeed, we look forward to enticing folks to explore this new building with additional games and a treasure hunt to boot! At both campuses, it will be a wonderful way to start our celebration.

As we head into the fall, you can expect an expanded Messenger, with some additional pages devoted to our history, our present mission, and our hopes for the future. One Sunday a month will be set aside to highlight one of the many significant ministries at Mount Olivet, and there will be several significant Service and Fellowship events spread across our anniversary year. So get ready, because celebrations matter! As the Psalmist of Israel sang centuries ago, so we also say today: "The Lord is both my future inheritance and present blessing. The boundary lines of life have fallen in pleasant places. Yes, I have a wonderful heritage!"



Our Journey through Acts continues in July

July 7: Acts 7:54-8:3 - The Stoning of Stephen

We hear the story of Stephen, a devoted member of the early church who is stoned by those who cannot believe, and indeed find threatening, God's redeeming work in Christ.

As we listen to Stephen's story, we might wonder: when have we struggled or suffered because of our faith or, from another point of view, when have we found God's call difficult to believe or follow?

July 14: Acts 8:26-39 - Philip and the Ethiopian Eunuch

We are treated to the unusual and delightful story of Philip, one of the early disciples, and his encounter with an Ethiopian Eunuch who wants to be baptized. It's probably hard for us to imagine just how surprised Philip was by this request, or the social and cultural boundaries he had to cross to grant the Eunuch's request as he realized that God's love was far more inclusive than he'd first thought.

So we might wonder together: what people is God calling to faith and to Mount Olivet that we had not expected and perhaps were not ready to receive, and what we can do to be faithful to sharing the word of God's expansive love?

July 21: Acts 9:1-19 - The Conversion of Saul

Today's story is the conversion of Saul, better known to us as the Apostle Paul - the name he took after his conversation. Saul was someone who initially persecuted the church but came to faith and became one of its most famous and effective promoters.


Like Saul, we might also harbor expectations about what God expects from us. How then, we might ask, do we respond when God calls us in a direction we'd never expected?

July 28: Acts 9:36-43 – The Raising of Tabitha

We will hear the story of the raising of Tabitha. Because of this sign of compassion and healing, many of Tabitha's neighbors came to faith.

For this reason, we might ask: Where has God been active in my life, and how might my witness to God's goodness invite others to consider a deeper relationship with God?

So where does God rank on your summer plans? Will God go with you? Does a break from school and work mean a break from God?

During a recent landscaping project of tree trimming and wood cutting, a man went to the hardware store to check about getting a new saw for cutting firewood. The salesman took a chain saw from the shelf and told him it was the newest model, with the latest in technology, guaranteed to cut ten cords of wood a day. The customer thought that sounded great, so he bought it on the spot.

The next day the customer returned, looking somewhat exhausted. "Something must be wrong with the saw," he moaned. "I worked as hard as I could and only managed to cut five cords of firewood. I used to cut seven with my old saw."

Confused, the salesman said, "Here, let me try it out back on some wood we keep there." They went to the woodpile, the salesman pulled the starter cord, and as the motor went Vrrooommm...., the customer jumped back shouting, "What's that noise?"

Sometimes we can be like the customer trying to saw wood without the power of the saw to help. Going to church helps me stay connected to the power of the Holy Spirit, makes life's daily chores and challenges more easily managed.

I hope your summer includes time to pause and remember you are loved and cherished by Christ. The Lord is with you. I look forward to seeing you in church. It's important to "encourage one another daily, as long as it's called "Today" (Hebrews 3:13). — PASTOR KALLAND






Blood Drive





The Charitable IRA Rollover Make a difference for Mount Olivet

Giving to the ministries of Mount Olivet Lutheran Church is a very thoughtful gesture and greatly appreciated. As you think about ways to make a gift or fulfill your yearly general fund pledge or your capital campaign pledge, you may want to consider using the Charitable IRA Rollover.

Key qualifications of the Charitable IRA Rollover include the following:

- You must be 70½ years or older to use the Charitable IRA Rollover.
- Only traditional IRAs are eligible for gifting.
- Checks from your IRA must be written out to qualified 501(c)(3) charities, which includes the church and its affiliated ministries.
- Donors can also request a direct stock transfer from their plan administrator to a charity.
- Gifts cannot be made to a private foundation or to a donor-advised fund.
- Gifts cannot be used to fund a charitable gift annuity or charitable remainder trust.
- IRA gifts will not be treated as taxable withdrawals.
- If you have not taken your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), this transfer will count towards your RMD for any given year.
- Any individual may directly transfer up to \$100,000 annually to any 501(c)(3) nonprofit.
