# September and the Secrets of Stewardship

There's nothing quite like September at Mount Olivet. We begin with Rally Sunday on September 8th, with choirs back in the loft, Sunday School up and running, and this year with a festive picnic and block party at both campuses to kick off our Centennial Anniversary celebration! Then comes Confirmation on September 15th, as we witness two hundred of our youth affirm their faith as young adults. On September 22nd, we give our fourth-graders Bibles and rejoice as they begin reading on their own the story and promises of God. At the close of the month, we pledge our support to our many ministries on Gratitude Sunday, **September 29th** – this year with a special dedication of the new addition at our West Campus and food trucks in Minneapolis.

Yes, September is a magnificent month at Mount Olivet, and woven through all the celebrations and events is stewardship. Indeed, were it not for the faithful and sacrificial stewardship of the generations before us, we would not have this incredible church and its many ministries.

But before you make any decisions about whether you will pledge, about how much you will commit to Mount Olivet's ministry, or even about whether you will attend a stewardship dinner, I want you to consider the following question: What if God doesn't use stewardship to raise money, but instead uses stewardship to raise Christians who trust God?

We tend to think about stewardship as the way the church raises money to pay its bills. And of course, like any other congregation, Mount Olivet does indeed have bills to pay... and salaries to provide, and insurance to cover, and numerous financial commitments that are critical to helping Mount Olivet fulfill its mission. And make no mistake – your faithful pledging allows us to plan a responsible budget, meet those commitments, and carry out the many ministries you value.

But... what if that's only half the story? What, in fact, if it's not even the most important half? You see, I believe that as important as your stewardship is to this congregation, it's even more important to you. Why? Because stewardship reminds us that all we have comes from God, that God has promised to provide what we need, and that God will always take care of us. And because of these promises, we are free to give what we have generously and grow in our faith and trust in God.

At this particular cultural moment – when we are besieged daily by literally thousands of ads seeking to create in us a sense of lack – it's incredibly easy to believe that we will never have enough to be happy. The Christian faith, however, offers a different message, one that revolves around what I think of as three "stewardship secrets."

- 1) Happiness doesn't lead to generosity; rather, generosity leads to happiness. It's easy to think that once we're successful, once we've achieved what we want, once we have enough – money, time, love, whatever – to be happy, then we can be generous. But across my life I've found the opposite to be true: Being generous to others creates happiness, and that happiness in turn makes it more likely to succeed in whatever we may be doing.
- 2) The only time money provides lasting happiness is when we give it away. Recent research demonstrates that while buying something for ourselves – a new piece of clothing, a dinner out, the latest gadget – provides an immediate surge of good feelings, in a relatively short while we return to our previous state of happiness. But buying something for someone else, or making a gift or donation to others, creates long-lasting periods of happiness and well-being.
- 3) The key to joyful stewardship is being intentional and prayerful. We have all been blessed with different financial resources. The key to growing in your generosity and trust in God is taking the invitation to faithful stewardship seriously. How does your giving compare to other financial commitments in your life? What would it mean to add five, ten, or twenty dollars a week to your offering? What does God want to do through the gifts which you have been given? These and similar questions move stewardship – and the faith and trust it creates – from being an after-thought to being front and center of your life.

Stewardship, it turns out, isn't simply something we do at Mount Olivet; rather, it's at the heart of who we are... and who God is calling us to be. I want to thank you in advance for your generosity and I look forward to seeing how God will grow our faith and trust in the coming year. In the meantime, see you in Church!

### New Pastoral Call for Mount Olivet: The Reverend Rebecca Wold Freeman

How long have you served as a Pastor? I was ordained in August of 2007, so about 12 years.

What other congregations has you served?

St. John American Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls,
SD as an associate pastor (2007-2010), Spirit
of Joy Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls, SD, as an
associate pastor (2011-2014), and Bethel Lutheran
Church in Northfield, MN, as an associate pastor
(2014-present)

#### What do you love about being a pastor?

I love God and I love people, and to be a pastor has

been such a life-giving way to bring the two together. I also love that it's a position that gets to interact with all generations of people...and quite often at the same time! It seems like such a natural place to live out my faith. Whether it be worship, fellowship, education, outreach, pastoral care, service — there isn't a place where God isn't present...and there's a whole lot of life going on when connections are made between God and people. For that I am grateful.

#### What are some things you like to do outside of work?

I like to be with my family any chance I get. Whether that be biking together, traveling together, playing games together, visiting our extended family and friends, or just relaxing at the lake (or in front of the tv at the end of the day), it's fun to be together. I also love watching/attending sporting events, especially when I know the athletes involved in them! I also really love a good cup of coffee and a good conversation.

#### Who are the people in your family?

My husband is Sedge. We've been married 12 years. We met at Gustavus almost 25 years ago, but it took us awhile to realize we might want to be married. We have two children— Stellan, a boy who is 10, and Liv (rhymes with Steve), a girl who is 7.

### What are there some interests/activities of your kids or husband that you'd like to share?

Sedge and Stellan both like to play hockey. Liv likes to swim. Our whole family likes to bike. We even did the first two days of the RAGBRAI (Annual Great Bicycle Ride Across Iowa) when our kids were 5 and 2....in a long bike train — Sedge and me on a tandem, Stellan on a tagalong attached to the tandem, and Liv in a trailer behind the tagalong. Jesus said to Nicodemus, "The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." John 3:8 (NRSV)



Last year, I read a book, *Sticking Points*, by Haydn Shaw, business and leadership developer. He noted there are four different generations in the workplace for the first time ever, and five generations of consumers. It brings richness and difficulty. He then describes the planet the elders grew up on compared to that of the budding adults of today. With all the change it can be as if we are from different planets, complete with different language, customs, and predicaments. It's new territory that demands new discernment.

Of course, I drew the connection to church.

This summer at Mount Olivet we dug into the stories of the early Christian church from the book of Acts. I'm struck by how the Spirit of Christ was constantly out ahead of the disciples. The disciples were essentially catching up-to how God's grace works, to whom and where it goes, and figuring out what it meant for the order of the church's life, proclamation, organization, and commitments. It caused sticking points, too.

Sometimes we might not all be speaking the same language, but I'm mindful that the Spirit on the first Pentecost allowed people to hear one another in one's own language. How would it be for us to continue to learn each other's language so we can communicate the heart of the gospel of Christ? How is God's Spirit propelling us today into new places and predicaments? How shall we catch up?

Gracious God, as the gales of your Spirit continue to gust, lead us to press on in your grace. Teach us that to which to cling and that which to let go, for the sake of Jesus Christ, our hope and life. Amen — PASTOR RUUD




### **BOOK DISCUSSIONS**



#### Editor's Note:



This September, Mount Olivet begins a year-long plus celebration of our 100th Anniversary. This is the first in a series of Messenger articles that will highlight various aspects of our history and the departments that provide the programs and coordinate the ministries of this great church. Since September is Stewardship month, it is appropriate that we begin our series with a look at the generosity of our members through the years.

# Mount Olivet Lutheran Church: 100 Years of Generosity

So, how did Mount Olivet grow from a small group of people into one of America's most significant churches? One must cite leaders with vision, of course, however, the underlying story is, from the beginning, the *generosity and commitment of the members!* 



The first service of the new Mount Olivet Lutheran Church was held at the vacant Iverson Farm Homestead at 55th Street and Lyndale Avenue South on a cold Jaunary day in 1920.



After outgrowing the Iverson farmhouse, a pledge of \$1800 resulted in the purchase of land, which included a former Richfield post office (pictured above on the right). It also quickly became too small for our growing church, and in 1923, the new building (pictured above and below) was built for \$3,000 right next to it. Much of the labor and equipment was donated by members of the congregation. The first worship service in the new church was held March 4, 1923.



# The Founders Set the Tone: Co-Laborers with God

A remarkable and typical example of dedication and sacrifice comes from an early history, which records: The Ladies Aid held monthly meetings of the congregation in homes and received offerings between \$200 and \$400 per month (\$2500 and \$5,000 in today's dollars). Remarkable and typical of the founders. And then there's this, from the Tenth Anniversary brochure (1930):

To the pioneers of Mount Olivet, charter members and others of the early years, this brochure is lovingly dedicated. You who dared venture into the struggles of starting a new congregation, well aware of the herculean task you were undertaking, coming as most of you did from another "struggling" congregation-you knew it meant hard work, endless sacrifice, and all the other discouragements of a small beginning. But you allowed the voice of faith to whisper in your ear: "We are God's co-laborers," and you dared to believe that with that partnership all would be well. Your faith is our example."

Most of us have heard the adage that when it comes to real estate, the three most important words are "location, location, location." Church leaders know that in the mission of the church it is "relationships, relationships," LOVING relationships emanating from the LOVE OF GOD. So, the generosity of the people built buildings with "love in the mortar joints" which made each building a place of love and service. Thanks be for those who came before us!

### Love in the Mortar Joints... Continued!

Generous giving built the first modern church at 50th and James for \$60,000 in 1939, and it was debt free in six years! Outgrowing the "new church" more quickly than anyone had imagined, the present church in Minneapolis was built in 1948 across the street and an educational unit was added in 1954. Again, buildings meant mission and outreach.

Cathedral of the Pines was purchased in 1949 with a handshake and a \$50 down payment from Pastor Reuben Youngdahl. The council immediately ratified the decision and pledged the amount necessary for the down payment. The vision continued to expand with the establishment of Mount Olivet Home in 1960, Careview in 1965, and then Mount Olivet Rolling Acres, also in 1965.

How did this growth happen? Bold faith, inspired leadership, and generosity. Pastor Reuben Youngdahl attracted persons who were successful in business. He inspired in them a vision and invited their gifts, and they provided crucial building blocks for significant projects.

At the same time, these ambitions would never have been realized absent the many smaller gifts made--often given sacrificially--that provided the underwriting for these ventures. Gifts large and small together built a great servant congregation.

### **Never Stop Dreaming**

Under Paul Youngdahl's leadership, the land for the Mount Olivet Retreat Center was purchased, Mount Olivet Home and Careview were expanded, Mount Olivet Day Services was created, and a second campus in Victoria was planted. In the interim time between the leadership of Senior Pastors Paul Youngdahl and David Lose, Pastor Craig Johnson, Senior Pastor John Hogenson, and Pastor Dennis Johnson kept new building projects going: 1) at the Minneapolis Campus, a new kitchen and elevator were added and greater space for music and education along James Ave. was built, and 2) at the West Campus, the space available for music, education, and fellowship has been greatly expanded. All of this speaks to the **significant vitality** and **faithful generosity** of a **dynamic congregation**, and these ministries will be expanded upon in coming issues of the *Messenger*. There is truly so much for which to be grateful!

### The Saints in Heaven

Under the leadership of Pastor Paul Youngdahl, with assistance from staff member Tom Wersell and volunteer leader Joe Langer, the planned giving ministry was initiated in the early 1980s. Wersell and Langer put much emphasis on the importance of persons having a will and using that will to continue the work of the church on earth after a life is over.

The next step was the creation of the Mount Olivet Vision Partners, in 1995, under the direction of Mari Carlson. To date, 600 individuals and families

have given or indicated a future gift through planned giving. Yes, the work of the saints in heaven is still going and makes a crucial difference. Pastor Paul Youngdahl, aware of the importance of these efforts, once wrote: The Endowment Fund is close to my heart and of great consequence for us and future generations...the Fund will open new doors of service in our Savior's name. Please include it in your estate planning, as our family has, for your joy and your church's strength.

### **Generosity of Time and Talents**

Mount Olivet members not only give financial gifts, but also contribute hours of volunteer time in fundraising for the ministries of Mount Olivet and our affiliates. The annual Garage Sale and Lutefisk Dinner, the Rolling Acres Golf Scramble, Gala, and more all require many people working together in a common cause (with a bonus side effect of building camaraderie and lasting friendships!). Camp volunteers, Sunday School and Confirmation teachers, ushers, pew and altar guild members, choir members and *all* the volunteers who run the myriad programs and outreach activities are the heartbeat of who we are as a servant congregation. The generosity shown by our volunteers will continue to be celebrated in upcoming issues. For now, thanks be for all who give of themselves with joy and gratitude!

### All This and Meatballs, too!

No article on stewardship at Mount Olivet would be complete without also mentioning our beloved fall Stewardship Dinners. The famous "Meatball Dinners" have been running continuously from the 1940s. Members come together around meatballs, scalloped potatoes, and more to hear the story of Mount Olivet's mission and to re-commit ourselves to being good stewards of God's gifts and to underwrite (pledge time!) the mission of bringing Christ's love to all. Fellowship, faithful anticipation, and generous giving underpin these annual events.

The story, of course, is not nearly over. Indeed, generosity and faithful stewardship is at at the heart of every Mount Olivet story. In future issues, we'll share how generosity supported our congregational programs and our missions around the community and our world. For now, know that the formula for a dynamic congregation is this fundamental: love + prayer + money + God's multiplying of gifts = miracles!




