What Next, Mount Olivet?

Recently, I came across some pictures of our kids when they were just learning to walk. In one of them, our son Jack has his hands gripped tightly around my thumbs, as I stand above him helping him take his first tottering steps. Looking at that picture, it struck me that Jack and I probably had very different perspectives of what was going on in that moment. To Jack, it likely seemed that everything depended on him holding fast to my thumbs, and of course his firm grip helped him keep his balance. At the same time, I knew that whether he held on or not, the rest of my hands were wrapped around his little wrists and I would never let him fall.

I think that's a pretty good image of the life of faith. What we do matters! Our attendance at worship, our participation in events, our prayers for our congregation, our generosity to support our mission – all of these efforts strengthen our ministry and make a difference. At the same time, we confess – and give thanks! – that God is always present, guiding, leading, and supporting us in our work to be the congregation God and the world need us to be. Certainly that has been our experience over the previous eighteen months. The creativity and resilience of our staff, the generosity of our members, the increased outreach of our whole congregation all made a huge difference. Yet we know and confess that it was by God's grace alone that we have come this far.

Both realities – our efforts and God's promises – matter. Except it's more than that, too. It's not just that we *can* participate in God's mission in the world, it's also that we are *blessed* when we do. Martin Luther captures that conviction brilliantly in explaining what it means to pray "thy will be done." Luther writes, "The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may also be done among us." I love Luther's confidence in God's promise. God's will simply *will* be done, whether we pray for it or not. But we still have a part to play, and so we ask God to work in us and through us. Ultimately, what we do matters not because God is dependent on us, but because God wants us to experience the sheer joy, wonder, and power of being part of God's kingdom.

This grants us a tremendous amount of freedom. We don't have to come to church, to give generously, to share what we have, to reach out in love to others, to work for a more fair world. God will continue to be at work whether we participate in that work or not (and even if we resist it!). But we are invited to be a part of that good work and experience God's power and presence in our lives more fully.

I believe we have learned a lot over the last year. We've learned how important our in-person worship and gatherings are. We've learned how much our faith and congregation mean to us. And we've learned so many new ways to connect with each other. All of which leaves us poised for new ambitions, important endeavors, and grand dreams. And you are now invited to be a part of God's work here by offering your prayers, support, financial strength, and regular participation so that God's will may not just be done – it will! – but that it may be done among us.

All of which invites us to ask: what will we use our God-given freedom for? What, in other words, comes next? Again, God has set you free. You don't *have* to do anything to earn God's grace and love. But you *get* to do all kinds of things to participate in the ongoing work of God's kingdom. So, I encourage you to make use of your freedom and come to a Stewardship event and learn of our dreams for the coming year. Use your freedom and pledge your support to the vital ministries of this congregation and experience more deeply the blessing of being generous. Use your freedom every Sunday morning to join us in worship and be strengthened in your faith. Use your freedom to take a class and grow in faith, join a fellowship group and make new friends, volunteer in one of our outreach activities and help your neighbor. In all these ways and more, God continues to lead, guide, and bless us by inviting us into God's work. All with the promise that while our efforts matter, God will never, ever let us fall.

This year's stewardship theme is "Endless Possibilities!" When we find ourselves in places of fear or worry about the future, when we think resources are scarce or our abilities are inadequate, know that Jesus' promises are true, "For God all things are possible."






EVERYTHING YOU EVER WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT THE NEW TESTAMENT

So what is the New Testament? I'm serious. Yes, we read from this book almost every Sunday. Yes, many of us read it in between Sundays, too. And, yes, it shares the core of our Christian faith by telling the story of Jesus. But, even given all that, have you ever stopped to wonder what it really is? For instance, why do we call it a "Testament," and what relation does it have to that other Testament? And, while we may be familiar with the Gospels, what about some of the other books – anyone read Philemon or Titus lately? And what's going on with Revelation, perhaps the strangest and scariest of biblical books?

This year, we're going to continue diving deep into the Bible with each other by following the pattern we started – and enjoyed so much! – last year: by asking questions! Like, what is a Gospel, anyway? Who was Paul, and why do his letters make up so much of the New Testament? And, seriously, what is up with Revelation?

Lots of questions, lots of discussion, lots of learning, and lots of fun. That's what we are planning on this coming year, beginning in October, as part of our Living the Message series at Mount Olivet. You can participate in-person or via recorded videos, and there are optional small group discussions if you'd like. Pastor Ruud and I are really excited to introduce you to the wild, wooly, and wonderful stories that make up our New Testament. See you in class!

Forest Bathing and Stargazing

Throughout the pandemic, many people discovered or perhaps rediscovered the gifts of nature, particularly its capacity to reduce stress. They headed outdoors to exercise, relax, and enjoy themselves. They went on camping trips, visited national parks, and flocked to local playgrounds.

Psychologists studied and wrote about this phenomenon, demonstrating that time spent in nature contributes to mental, emotional, and physical well-being. It reduces worry and increases calm. It reminds us that we belong to a vast cosmos: from the tiniest blade of grass to the farthest flung star in space. We belong. We belong to a created order that has persisted for billions of years, and that will continue, long after each of us is gone.

From a Christian spiritual perspective, time outdoors enjoying the beauty and multiplicity of nature reminds us that God upholds all living things in wisdom and in care.

What recent activities have connected you to the natural world?

We recommend giving forest bathing, the simple method of being calm and quiet amongst the trees, observing nature around you while breathing deeply, a try. In July, participants of Renewing Connections: A Retreat for Women, learned about the art of forest bathing in an afternoon session led by Kristen Mastel, Master Naturalist. Through mindfulness, breathing, and sensory exercises, the women explored the sights and sounds of the Conference & Retreat Center. They watched the blades of grass sway in the wind and noticed how the sunlight danced through the leaves. They listened to the calls of the birds and even tasted the wind.

Next time you find yourself outdoors, take a moment to pause and truly immerse yourself in God's amazing creation. Bathe in the beauty of the earth. Soak in the calm rhythm of nature. Remember that just as God cares for the birds and butterflies, and for the land and the water, so God cares for you. Or join us in September and gaze at the awe-inspiring night sky (see the sidebar for more details about our upcoming stargazing event). To feel connected to the world around us is a gift. But an even greater gift is knowing that we belong within it and to it.
