Yes, this issue of the *Messenger* is absolutely ordinary in that it bears a pretty strong resemblance to other issues, sharing news of various events happening in our congregation, offering brief reports on the impact of our giving, and sharing devotions and reflections meant to inspire and strengthen your faith life. You see, ordinary.

And yet... when you read through the issue with care, you'll soon recognize that the "ordinary" work of this congregation is really quite extraordinary! As I've shared before in this monthly note to you, each of us can do many wonderful things as individuals and, together, we can achieve things that are simply remarkable. For instance, this is the month that we will likely surpass sharing 200,000 meals with neighbors through our weekly Thursday Community Meal since the start of the pandemic – extraordinary!

Similarly, our outreach to others is regularly powerful. On page 4, for instance, you will read about the impact several of our local, national, and international partners are making and the ways in which Mount Olivet members are supporting that incredible work. On pages 6 and 7 you'll read about ways you can combat food scarcity in our communities by contributing to our Thanksgiving Food Drive and how you can make the holiday brighter for local families by supporting our annual Christmas For All service project. We'll also be starting our annual MOCW Coat and Mitten drive (details on page 6) this season as well! All of these efforts afford us the opportunity to extend God's love in tangible ways.

Throughout November we'll continue our series on "Why Church?". Mount Olivet is one of the great exceptions to national church trends, as we continue to grow, both in membership and in attendance at worship and events, while so many churches are struggling. Part of the reason is that we take seriously the importance of connecting our faith to everyday life and, in this way, try to make our faith both more relevant and applicable. This month, we'll focus on how church can help us live with courage in the face of loss, make hard choices that will yield lasting benefits, as well as recognize and give thanks for our blessings in a culture of scarcity.

Speaking of worship, November affords a number of additional opportunities to gather together and be encouraged in faith and life through the fellowship communal worship fosters. We'll hold our youth-led Thanksgiving Early worship service on Sunday, November 19, with worship at 6pm and dinner at 7pm. This is always a favorite service because of the insights shared by our youth on what they're grateful for and, if you'll be away over the holidays, this is a wonderful chance to gather with your Mount Olivet family ahead of your travels. We'll also continue our recent tradition of giving thanks for the many blessings we enjoy by living in this country on Thanksgiving Eve, with worship at 6pm on Wednesday, November 22, followed by treats and fellowship at both campuses. And on the last Sunday in November we'll move into the season of Advent. This year we will focus on St. Luke's story of all the ways in which God was at work to prepare for the birth of the Messiah, and how God continues to be at work in our preparations to celebrate the birth of Christ with a focus on "Coming Home for Christmas."

Do you see what I mean? In so many ways, this congregation is ordinarily extraordinary. So read this month's issue with care... and then gratitude for all we accomplish. And as you do, please remember that we couldn't do any of this without your support – your attendance at worship and events; your generous gifts, pledges, and offering; your time in volunteering and outreach; and your prayers for our staff and congregation. As we've been saying across this autumn season, You are Mount Olivet! And, together, We are Mount Olivet, a family of faith that helps us believe the good news of Christ, belong to a servant congregation, and become the people and church God needs us to be. Thank you. Even more, thank God for you!

RISE EARLY LEARNING CENTER

By offering child care adjacent to affordable housing, Rise Early will strengthen families by providing a family-centered approach to education that includes high-quality preschool to ensure kids are school-ready, and wrap-around services for families to help them make the most of their opportunities. Pastor MacLean and I had a chance to visit the construction site for RELC and we both came away impressed by the thoughtfulness of the design and inspired by the coalition of faith communities determined to make sure the kids of families at the Rise on 7 affordable housing endeavor start school prepared for success. Research has shown that when you help a child be prepared for school, not only are they far more likely to succeed, but so are their children. This program therefore contributes to generational success and not only improves the lives of participants but our whole community. RELC will be holding their Annual Fall Celebration and Fundraiser on Thursday, November 9, at Beth El Synagogue, 5225 Barry St West, St. Louis Park. To learn more, check out riseearlylearningcenter.org. Mount Olivet, through member donations and a congregational commitment, has so far contributed \$50,000 to this important endeavor!

THEE ALLIANCE/RIP MEDICAL DEBT

As one of the founding members of THEE Alliance, a coalition of faith-based groups participating in the nation-wide RIP medical debt relief program, I'm both pleased and proud to announce that total contributions from Alliance partners have topped \$400,000 (with \$80,000 from Mount Olivet!) that has, in turn, translated into nearly \$50M (yes, million!) of forgiven medical debt transforming the lives of more than 50,000 families across the country!

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

In addition to continuing direct medical assistance to Ukrainian refugees resulting from the Russian invasion, Lutheran World Relief has also been providing critical assistance to those caught in the earthquakes in Turkey and Morocco. LWR specializes in both disaster relief and sustained agricultural development in some of the most dangerous parts of the world. It was formed immediately after World War II and has been spreading the love of God in tangible, life-saving ways for 75 years. In the last three years, Mount Olivet has contributed more than \$100,000 to the life-saving work of LWR.



I have a hunch that if you asked church-going Christians what part of the Star Tribune God was most interested in, they would reply, "The religion section, of course." An understandable answer, perhaps, but... not very Lutheran. One of the most notable, controversial, and – in my humble opinion – important theological assertions made by Martin Luther is that God is equally interested in all parts of our life. The parts we name "sacred," as well as those we call "secular." God cares about what happens at church on Sundays, and God cares just as much about what goes on in our lives Monday through Saturday.



In fact, Luther believed that God cares SO much about our Monday-through-Saturday lives, that he actually taught that a primary purpose of Sunday was to get us ready for the tasks, challenges, and opportunities that occupied the rest of our week. This was a departure from more than 1000 years of church history! Rather than assume the work accomplished by God's "right hand" (which is how theologians describe God's work in the church) is superior to the things accomplished through God's "left hand" (you know, everything outside the church like the government, family, civic institutions, etc.), Luther believed that God was equally concerned with matters of both "the church" and "the world." Which is why I like to describe God as "ambidextrous," working equally through both church and civic structures for the health of the world.

So come to the December session of Living the Message as we learn together how each and every one of us has an important role to play in God's mission to bless the world God loves so much. — PASTOR LOSE
