Session Overview

"It's one thing to get the people out of Egypt. It's another thing to get Egypt out of the people." In this session we'll look into the drastic difference between Pharaoh's economy of relentless, anxious productivity and God's economy of gracious, committed neighborliness. The biblical story of the Israelites' struggles in the wilderness may give key insight into our human tendency to fear scarcity and rely only on our own constant work to achieve security, success, and value. We then see how God's command and value of Sabbath illuminates a more free and interconnected understanding of ourselves, our neighbors, and God which focuses more on "daily bread" and embracing life as God's cared-for and beloved people.

- Exodus 16 and 17 Bread from Heaven, Water from the Rock
- Deuteronomy 5 The Ten Commandments

Questions

- 1. Who and/or what are the Pharaohs we face today, or how is the voice of Pharaoh still present? From where? How? May we even face it in ourselves?
- 2. In what ways are we conditioned to be fearful of scarcity, and/or what ways are we encouraged to see our value and worth only in terms of what we do, achieve, and/or produce?
- 3. How does faith factor into keeping the Sabbath command?
- 4. In what ways may the Sabbath command embolden us to say "no" to Pharaoh today?
- 5. Does learning about these stories about Sabbath help transform your idea of rest? Does it give you new inspiration? How?
