Walking in the Light

One of my all-time favorite quotations is, "It is better to light a candle than curse the darkness." I'd always seen it attributed to Eleanor Roosevelt, which made sense, as there were few of her generation who were more active in working for greater equality. But as I recently learned, it was actually said by Adlai Stevenson about Eleanor Roosevelt. He, in turn, was quoting a Methodist preacher, William Watkinson. In a sermon published in 1907, Watkinson argued that getting angry and decrying difficult challenges "is so much easier and cheaper than good works and proves a popular temptation. Yet it is far better to light a candle than curse the darkness."

There is certainly plenty of darkness we could decry – wars in multiple parts of the world, inequity at home and abroad, a contentious political landscape accompanied by challenges to the very fabric of our democracy. Yet... how much better if we each, and together, worked constructively and actively to make a positive difference rather than voice our discontent. For this reason, during Sunday worship this January we are exploring some of the passages of Scripture where God reminds us that we are people of the light, those who live with hope, who work for the good, and who trust that God continues to guide and lead us.

This is a fitting theme for Epiphany, which is often called the "season of light." The name "Epiphany" comes from a Greek word that means "to reveal" or "enlighten" and is connected with the journey of the Magi to see the glory of the baby Jesus (which we will celebrate on January 7) as well as the promise that God's love is revealed to the whole world in Jesus. We often use the word "epiphany" when we've had a breakthrough or when a new and important insight dawns on us for the first time – when, that is, we've had a personal revelation. In the northern hemisphere where so many of our religious traditions originated, the days get progressively longer as we journey through Epiphany, drawing us closer to the season of spring and the ultimate manifestation of God's love in Holy Week, Good Friday, and Easter.

There are a number of passages in Scripture that talk about light. Here are the ones we'll explore together in January and early February:

January 14: the first of God's acts of creation is to separate light and darkness (Genesis 1:1-5).

January 21: the prophet Isaiah promises God's presence and therefore commands his listeners to "arise and shine" (Isaiah 60:1-5).

January 28: when Simeon sees the baby Jesus in the Temple, he declares that Jesus "will be a light to enlighten the Gentiles" (Luke 2:22-32).

February 4: Jesus' command in the Sermon on the Mount "to let your light shine" (Matthew 5:13-16).

February 11: the promise at the beginning of John's Gospel that Jesus is "the light that the darkness cannot overcome" (John 1:1-5).

So during the dark and cold days of winter, and when the world around us can also seem rather dark and cold, let's walk together in the light, work together for what is right, and light a candle so that others may experience God's love and grace through our words and deeds!



DEVOTION

In the Bible, the Epiphany is Jesus' visit from the Magi. Those aristocratic men from the East (often referred to as kings or wise men) followed a star to see the newborn baby Jesus in Bethlehem. It's the manifestation of Jesus to Gentiles.

It doesn't say in the Bible how many wise men showed up. We assume three, because three gifts are mentioned: gold, frankincense and myrrh. Gold was considered a symbol of kings, frankincense a perfume representing divinity, and myrrh an anointing and embalming oil that symbolized death.



Have you ever had an epiphany, an awakening? A realization that Jesus is indeed the Christ, the Son of God, who takes away the sin of the world? This new year, may we daily come to believe that Jesus' life, death, and resurrection makes new life possible today, and eternal life a reality for all of our tomorrows.



Join Mount Olivet pastors for a snapshot into the life and witness of one of the 20th century's most notable Christian theologians and preachers, Dietrich Bonhoeffer. By surveying some of the defining and rich theological musings and writings of this young German Lutheran pastor, (Did you know he only lived to 39 years old?!) and examining how he sought to give clearer definition into how and why faith in Christ orients our thoughts, words, and deeds as Christians, we'll consider his lasting insight for us still. We'll also discuss how he became a key founder of the German Confessing Church in opposition to the Nationalist Socialist takeover of country, culture, and church, and his involvement with a plot to kill Hitler which led to his arrest and execution by the Nazis a mere month before the German surrender in World War II. God Hidden and Revealed: The Theology of the Cross

Luther was fairly convinced that one of the casualties of our human sinfulness is our ability to predict where God appears. In short, we impose our human or worldly conceptions of power onto God, thereby risking missing where God actually shows up.

For instance, Jesus is not born in Jerusalem, capital city of Israel, but in Bethlehem, a backwater town with no significance. Nor is Jesus – the one proclaimed as "king of



kings" – born in a palace, but rather in a stable, and his first resting place isn't the finest crib in the land, but a manger, an actual feeding trough for animals.

Similarly, Jesus ends his earthly life not as a conquering hero, as almost everyone expected, but rather as a criminal being executed on the cross for a capital offense. For Luther, this disruption of our expectations is no accident, as it reminds us that we don't have to be perfect, powerful, or even always joyful to encounter God. Rather, God meets us where we are, and especially in our challenges, setbacks, and brokenness. Or, to use the language of Luther, when we seek God in places of "glory" – worldly power and might – God is hidden from us. But when God surprises us by showing up in suffering – Christ's and our own – God is revealed as the one who meets us where we are, accepts us as we are, and loves us unconditionally. Join us in February as we are surprised (again and again!) by where God shows up to meet us in redemptive love!

Wedding planning is often incredibly meaningful as a couple or family brings to life a vision they may have been holding for years. Abraham Lincoln famously said, "Give me six hours to chop down a tree and I will spend the first four sharpening the ax." While it's easy to be swept up in the fun, excitement, and details of wedding planning, marriage and divorce research shows that couples really benefit from premarital education, and that it can help reduce the likelihood of divorce.
