A Resurrection Community

Why is it so often easier to believe bad news than good?

This was a question Pastor Dixon and I were wrestling with while recording a recent episode of *The Gospel Unplugged*, our weekly preview of the Sunday sermon passages. We noticed that in pretty much all of the Gospel accounts, everyone has a hard time believing that Jesus has been raised from the dead... even though Jesus told them – several times! – that he would be crucified, die, and then be raised on the third day.

Maybe that's normal. As devastating as the news of a cancer diagnosis or failed marriage may be, we're kind of used to that. The hope of remission, or the promise of a renewed relationship, however, might be harder to accept. Perhaps it's easier to steel yourself for bad news than open yourself up to the possibility of good news... or, more to the point, the possibility of being disappointed when the good news doesn't prove true.

Interestingly, in St. Luke's story of Easter, in response to the terror of the women at the empty tomb, the angelic messengers don't simply announce Christ's resurrection, but also remind them of Jesus words and promise: The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." And then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. (Luke 24:5-9)

That's an interesting way to think about the church: the place where we remind each other of the good news, of the promise of resurrection, and of the possibility that life is stronger than death and love more powerful than hate.


Think about belonging to a community like this: a place where you can count on being reminded that God loves you, that resurrection and new life are possible, that death does not have the last word, and that you are not alone. We gather each week precisely because it can be hard to believe and trust the good news of new life and God's ongoing work in the world for more than about seven days in a row without being reminded of it again!

This month, we'll be intentionally reminding each other of God's promises of resurrection, hope, and new life in two important ways. First, on Sundays, we'll be reading various stories in the four gospels about Jesus' resurrection appearances to learn together how to be a community of the resurrection; how to be, that is, a place that, first, recognizes that it can be difficult at times to believe good news and, second, therefore works extra hard to remind each other of the incredible news of God's grace and love and the power of resurrection.

Second, we'll also be hosting two Cathedral of the Pines Camp Sundays this month. On April 14 at the West Campus and on April 28 at the Minneapolis Campus, we'll have a chance to give thanks for our Cathedral of the Pines Camp and inaugurate our celebration of its 75th anniversary. COP is many things, of coursea place of cherished traditions, a beloved ministry where so many kids grow in their relationships with God and each other, and a bedrock ministry of Mount Olivet. But in light of Luke's story of the resurrection, it also occurs to me that COP is a place where kids learn to trust and believe the good news of God's incredible love for us. To put it another way, COP is where kids - no matter what they may be contending with at home or at school – learn that new life is always possible. At COP, God's love and the possibility of new life become more than just ideas. As Pastor Kalland likes to say, COP is where Jesus "grew legs" for him and became more than just a story in the Bible. So let's celebrate the wonderful treasure we have in COP and once again remind each other that resurrection life is possible.

Yes, there is plenty of bad news out there. (Which might just be why it's easier to believe.) But at this Church we come together to hear, remember, and remind each other of the good news of God's love for all, the promise of new life, and the hope of resurrection. So come help us live into the promise of new life and resurrection. It's the best story around, and we get to tell it week in and week out!

I love when, upon discovering I'm a pastor, someone asks, "Where is your church?" Often I'll offer our Minneapolis and Victoria addresses. But sometimes, when I'm feeling a little more mischievous, I'll instead reply, "Well, right now some of my church are teaching school and others are learning, some are working downtown and others from home, and some are volunteering to make their communities better while others are taking care of a loved one." Then, when I get the inevitable puzzled face in response, I'll say, "Oh, you mean the building we gather in each week," and then share our address.

According to Martin Luther, you see, the church is not simply, or even primarily, a building. Rather, the church is the Body of Christ, Jesus' current-day disciples sharing the good news of God's grace through word and deed. And "deed," in this case, is really important. The church doesn't just talk about the gospel, but also lives it by being faithful in our everyday lives and roles.

If the church is God's people at work in the world, you may wonder, then why do we come together each week in our beautiful building? Great question! Sometimes it's easy to see God at work in the world, and sometimes God's presence can be more ambiguous, or even ambivalent. When you have a chance to help someone or make a positive impact, for instance, you can point directly to how God is working through you to bless this world. But when things aren't going well, or it feels like what you do doesn't make a difference, or when the darkness of the world seems overpowering, it's easy to lose faith. So we gather together on Sunday to hear God's promises and call, and then we are sent out into the world to live that good news. The church, in this sense, is that living body that is both called and sent, gathered and scattered, to care for the world God loves so much!



THE MOUNT OLIVET CHURCH FOUNDATION

Over the years, Mount Olivet has been blessed by generous members, generous in their weekly giving and generous in leaving a legacy to the Church through an estate gift. In 1980, Pastor Paul Youngdahl created the Mount Olivet Foundation as a place to steward such gifts. He understood that it is all too easy for a church to become dependent on funds donated through wills and estates rather than encourage present members to take active responsibility for their church through their stewardship. He also understood that funds placed in a foundation can yield benefits for the church for years, and even decades to come.

Currently, the Mount Olivet Church Foundation uses its money for three purposes:

- 1. It allocates a 5% draw of the funds available to support the regular operation of the church. In this sense, the Foundation functions like an endowment, where the interest from invested funds supports the ongoing ministries and programs of the church.
- 2. At the direction of the Church Council, Foundation Funds can be used for special projects. These may include capital projects to enhance our buildings or strategic investments in ministry areas at church or through our partners.
- 3. Foundation funds also function as emergency reserves, a category that is important in case of an unforeseen crisis. We are grateful to have never yet needed to use this reserve!!

I mentioned earlier that the Foundation is a place we steward gifts made through the wills and estates of members who want to see their church flourish well beyond their lives, but the Foundation receives current gifts as well. In fact, two years ago, Mount Olivet received its largest single gift from a living member who wanted to see the impact of her giving during her lifetime. Interest from that gift, placed in the Foundation, allowed us to renew some of the spaces we use for music and education as our Sunday School and Confirmation programs have grown. Over the seven years I have been at Mount Olivet, the Foundation has more than doubled through gifts like this one, the wise use of these funds by the Council, the strategic stewardship of the Foundation by the Investment Committee of our Church Council, and the legacy gifts of dedicated members.

Thirty years ago, as the Foundation began to grow, Mari Carlson, then our Director of Development, established the "Vision Partners" program as a way of recognizing all those who wanted to leave a legacy to Mount Olivet Church or one of its Affiliated Ministries. Each year, we recognize our Vision Partners in a variety of ways and often gather everyone together for a special event to celebrate the difference these gifts have made... and continue to make!
