# Recognizing God at Work... Everywhere!

In his very fine sermon the week after Easter, Pastor MacLean referenced the Greek word *anagnorisis*, which means "recognition." It's a familiar literary device, both in the plays of ancient Greece, as well as in modern novels and movies. It occurs when one character suddenly recognizes someone they hadn't earlier or learns something true about him or herself formerly hidden. It often marks a turning point in that character's life, as that new recognition and knowledge makes all kinds of things possible.

There have been several anagnorisis-moments in the resurrection appearance stories we have been reading on Sundays this Easter season. Pastor MacLean's sermon described one of them, when two disciples who walked with Jesus from Jerusalem to Emmaus fail to recognize him until he sits with them at supper. In an instant, their whole perspective changes when they recognize him "in the breaking of the bread" (Luke 24:35). Another occurred in St. John's story of the disciples out fishing sometime after Easter when Jesus calls to them. At first, they don't recognize him, but soon one shouts, or maybe whispers, "It is the Lord," and that changes everything (John 21:7). Another important moment of recognition happens at Pentecost (May 19), when the disciples, anxiously awaiting the gift Jesus has promised, receive the Holy Spirit and suddenly see the challenges ahead of them not as barriers, but as opportunities to share the good news of Christ's resurrection with everyone they meet (Acts 2).

The key element of these biblical stories is the sudden awareness that God is indeed present and active, even if you hadn't recognized that before. And that doesn't happen only in the Bible! We, too, have moments of recognition that can leave a lasting impression on us and shape our view of what is possible.

In fact, May is filled with such moments. We celebrate our high school seniors at baccalaureate on May 12 at the West Campus and on May 19 at the Mpls Campus. As we celebrate their accomplishments and mark this turning point in their lives, we also recognize things in them we perhaps hadn't seen – a new maturity or readiness for more responsibility – and perceive that God has been at work in their lives through Hi-League, Cathedral Choir, Cathedral of the Pines Camp, and more. As we come to the close of another year of Sunday School and Confirmation this month, we not only thank our teachers and the many volunteers who make

these programs possible, but also recognize God's presence and activity through them in nurturing faith in our children. Similarly, as we give thanks for our choirs after another wonderful year, we also recognize not simply that music enhances our worship, but that God is at work through the hymns and anthems to strengthen our faith. Little wonder why we like to say at Mount Olivet, "We know our faith because we sing it!"

In this sense, May is a "bridge" month, drawing to a close many of the activities and patterns of our academic and program year while preparing for all that summer brings. (Speaking of which, summer worship hours with services at 9 and 10am only begin May 26!) Transitions bring with them opportunities for deeper recognition of growth and possibility. Such moments won't end this month, of course. As we head into summer we'll see our kids grow through their experiences at Cathedral of the Pines Camp and Day Camps, we'll recognize that even as we volunteer to alleviate hunger and need in our community, we are also richly blessed in the opportunity to serve others, and we may discover how much we enjoy worshipping online when we are away from home. In all these moments, we discover again and anew that God is not only active on Sundays but is part of our lives every day, every month, all the time!

In fact, perhaps the most important moment of *anagnorisis* is when we realize that Sunday worship is not an end in itself but is the hour each week that prepares us to recognize God in all kinds of places we hadn't thought to look. At work and play, at home and in our relationships, in the variety of places we find ourselves and more, God is already present, inviting our recognition of and participation in God's ongoing work to love and bless this world.

So as we enter this busy month of transitions and celebrations, I pray that you have a new and deeper recognition that God loves you, is with you, and is working through you for the sake of your neighbors and world.

#### **DEVOTION**

"How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity!" -Psalm 133:1

Perhaps you've heard the story of the Special Olympics athlete poised to win the gold medal in the 100-meter dash when he noticed that a fellow 100-meter competitor had slipped and fallen. Rather than finish the race in first place, this front-runner turned around, held out his hand, picked up the man who had fallen, and



walked with the other runner across the finish line, hand-in-hand, in last place.

The story raises the question, where and when are we willing to give up what is perceived as the prize for the gift of living together in unity?"

The Psalmist writes in Psalm 133, "How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity."

Kindred are people joined together by God's grace, which is all of us. Still, we are really good at making distinctions between one another. We like to elevate some and dismiss others, but God makes it clear that living in unity means walking with each other in good and in bad, not a step ahead nor a step behind, but *together*.

Just as the Special Olympics athletes showed us, moments that look or feel like "last place" are actually the places where God's grace, love and unity most clearly dwell.

Dear God, thanks for your grace, which allows us to live together in unity. Amen. — PASTOR FREEMAN

## **MINISTRY MOMENT: COMMUNITY MEALS**

On March 14, 2024, our Mount Olivet Community Meals program celebrated its fifth anniversary. Beginning in 2019 as an inside seated dinner, these meals grew and shifted with the pandemic to be distributed curbside. During the pandemic, 700-1000 meals were served twice a week and bag lunches were also provided. Today 500-650 meals are distributed every Thursday evening with a choice of entree and more, including cakes, sweets, and treats that are donated from Jerry's Foods.

Many of those picking up meals are seniors on fixed incomes. No proof of financial need is required and there is no limit to the number of meals requested. Many meals are picked up by others for relatives and neighbors. As Sally McNamee, Mount Olivet's director of culinary services who heads up these Community Meals, says: "There is still much food insecurity, and each person has needs we are not privy to. It's our job to just make and share these meals—no questions asked." To date, there have been over 180,000+ meals served, 1,200 volunteer shifts created, and... 6,200 pounds of oranges shared! Thank you to all our members, volunteers, and staff who have made—and make—this ministry possible!


