Serving Others: Our Congregational DNA

I believe that congregations, like people, have a DNA – that is, they have built-in strengths, are pre-disposed toward certain behaviors, and are even hardwired to view and act in the world in predictable ways. If you were to ask me what Mount Olivet's DNA is, you might imagine I would reply with something about our wonderful music and worship or our investment in our youth or our commitment to accompany people at every age and stage of life. And those would be good guesses because, well, each of those things is true! But... I would be inclined to point to a deeper impulse, which is to respond to the needs around us in love or, to put it more simply: our DNA is to serve others!

Think about it. We put great time and care into our music and worship not simply for the sake of aesthetic beauty, but because we know that beautiful music and wonderful preaching and worship inspire and encourage people. We do indeed invest in our youth, not simply because we "like kids," but because we know it's hard growing up and want to surround our youth with love. Similarly, the congregational care we offer through hospital visits or inter-generational events are carried out with the hope of caring deeply for people no matter where they are in life. We have it in our DNA to serve others.

In addition to how we live this out in all the ministries of Mount Olivet Church, our DNA expresses itself powerfully through the magnificent work of our Affiliated Ministries: Mount Olivet Home, Careview Home, and Day Services; Mount Olivet Rolling Acres; Mount Olivet Conference & Retreat Center; Cathedral of the Pines Camp; Mount Olivet Counseling Center; and Mount Olivet School of Music & the Arts. In this month's letter, I thought I'd share a brief bit of background and an update on the ministry of each.

Mount Olivet Homes (semi-independent living), Careview (skilled nursing and memory care), and Day Services (adult day care) – was created when the board of the Vocational Hospital (which trained nurses) felt that the community would be better served by a nursing home and approached Pastor Reuben Youngdahl in 1958 to ask whether Mount Olivet Church would take the lead. Nearly seventy years later, Mount Olivet Homes are widely recognized as one of the premiere elder care institutions in the state.

Mount Olivet Rolling Acres (MORA) has a similar story, as a foundation set up to care for children with developmental disabilities purchased land and began to build a program when it ran into financial difficulties. Because Mount Olivet had a reputation for responding to community needs, the board of that foundation approached Pastor Reuben Youngdahl to ask if Mount Olivet would take over, and with the enthusiastic support and financial commitment of the congregation, Mount Olivet Rolling Acres was born in 1965. Today, MORA serves nearly 4,000 adults with developmental disabilities daily.

Cathedral of the Pines Camp (COP), celebrates its 75th anniversary this summer, and it could not have been a better example of all that is good about Camp – full sessions (2,000 kids in all), kids learning to be vulnerable and growing in their faith and in friendships, attentive staff and adults to care for them, all in the beautiful north woods! May we continue another seventy-five years... at least!

The Mount Olivet Conference & Retreat Center has an interesting tie to COP, as the land in Farmington it inhabits was originally purchased during the gas crisis of the 70s in case it became too expensive to bus kids to Lutsen. Fortunately, that was not the case, and Pastor Paul Youngdahl had the vision to create a place of exceptional hospitality and rest that has provided a much-needed and much appreciated sense of sabbath for Mount Olivet members and many others for nearly 50 years.

The Mount Olivet Counseling Center, opened in 1963, continues its original mission to tend the mental health and resilience of our community. Individual, family, marital, and group counseling is offered regularly, with about two-thirds of the session devoted to Mount Olivet members and the remainder gratefully used by folks in our community. You can learn more about the Counseling Center and meet some of our wonderful staff on Mental Health Sunday (October 13), an event co-sponsored by the Center, our Congregational Care team, and our Mental Health Task Force.

The Mount Olivet School of Music & the Arts gathers exceptional musicians from around the Twin Cities to offer musical lessons to students of all ages (currently we have students ranging in age from 7 to 77!). At times we have been blessed to support the band and orchestra of our neighbor, Burroughs Elementary School, and more recently we have added art classes for all ages and also support our Fika Music Series (beginning October 13 at 12:15pm at the Mpls Campus).

So... do you see what I mean? Meeting community needs and serving others in the name of Christ – it's in our DNA! Thank you for your support of all of our ministries!

There are two main sources of revenue that fund Mount Olivet's ministries:


- 1. Your gifts, pledges, and offerings

The Foundation contains estate gifts, dedicated gifts, and other funds offered to grow our ministries, ensure Mount Olivet's future, and close the budget gap between our offerings and expenses. Our hope and intention is to fully fund our budget with member offering and program revenue.
