Class Title: Jacob: The Heel to Israel

Overview

Jacob is a jerk. He's sneaky and conniving. His name literally means the heel, because he came out of the womb grasping at his brother's heel, foreshadowing of the struggle to come. If you follow professional wrestling, you'll know that there are often characters, described as "heels," whose sole purpose is to antagonize and thwart the good guys. Jacob is a heel.

For some unknown reason God has chosen Jacob, the younger brother, the trickster, the manipulative gamesman to become Israel, the father of God's nation. This unlikely character is the bridge between God's promise to Abraham and the fulfillment of that promise that we've come to know in Jesus. We don't know why. But God has chosen this peculiar character, so maybe there's hope for us all!
